Do not allow dirt or grease to enter the system. Always wear standard hand, ear, and eye protection when servicing the air suspension system.*

- Avoid damage to air lines and cables.
- Removal and installation is only to be performed by fully qualified personnel.

AIR STRUT REMOVAL

1. RAISE THE VEHICLE.
2. REMOVE APPLICABLE REAR WHEEL AND WHEEL WELL LINING. (FIGURES 1, 2)

3. REMOVE AIR LINE FROM THE STRUT. REMOVE OLD AIR FITTING AND DISCARD. (FIGURES 3, 4, 5)

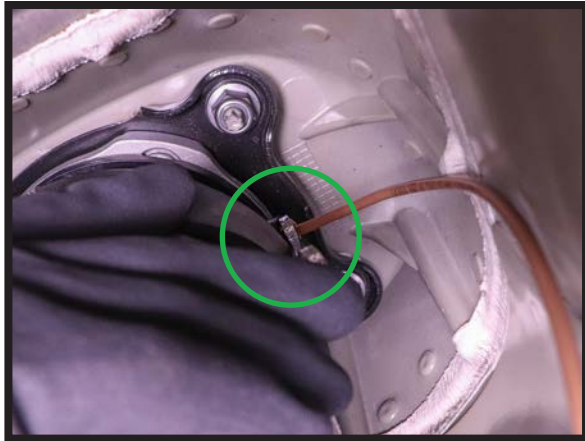

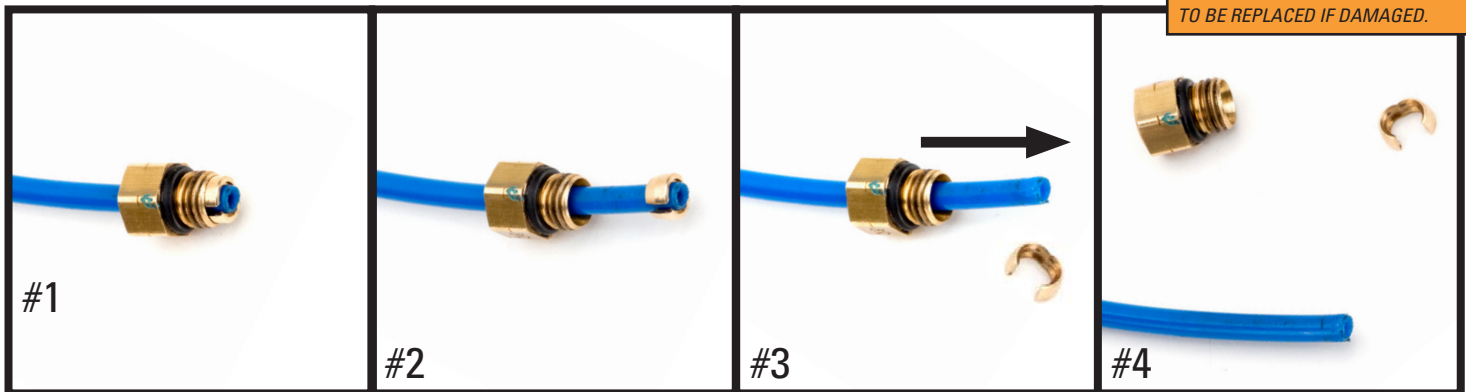

REMOVAL



Prior to inserting the existing air line into the new air fitting you will need to remove the old original equipment air line fitting.

NOTE: SCRATCHES AND/OR DEEP CUTS IN THE AIR LINE CAN RESULT IN POSSIBLE LEAKS. INSPECT THE AIR LINE BEFORE INSERTION. AIR LINE NEEDS TO BE REPLACED IF DAMAGED.



OE AIR LINE FITTING

SLIDE THE THREADED PORTION UP THE LINE AND SPREAD THE COLLET OPEN TO REMOVE

SLIDE THE AIR FITTING OFF OF THE AIR LINE

AIR LINE IS READY FOR INSTALLATION

4. REMOVE THE BOTTOM MOUNT BOLT AND NUT. (FIGURE 6, 7)

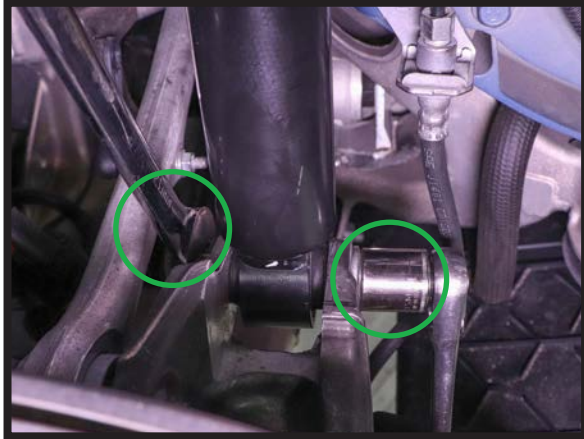

7. REMOVAL COMPLETE.

AIR STRUT INSTALLATION



Tighten all nuts and bolts to manufacturer's specifications during the installation process.



Do not remove the air fitting from the air strut. Doing so may cause damage and/or void warranty.

1. LUBRICATE THE LOWER MOUNT BUSHING AND INSTALL THE NEW ARNOTT AIR STRUT INTO VEHICLE.

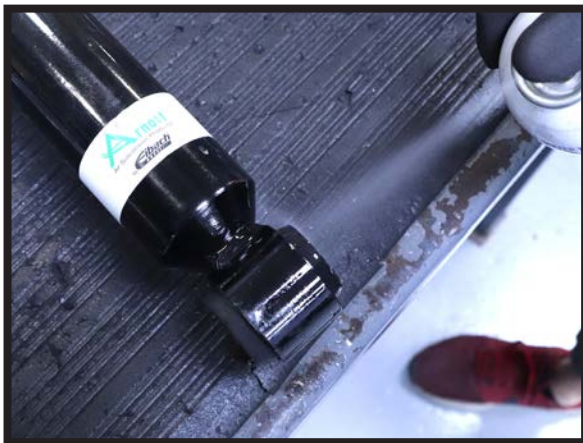

2. REINSTALL THE THREE (3) FACTORY TOP MOUNT NUTS. TIGHTEN TO MANUFACTURER'S SPECIFICATIONS. (FIGURE 12)

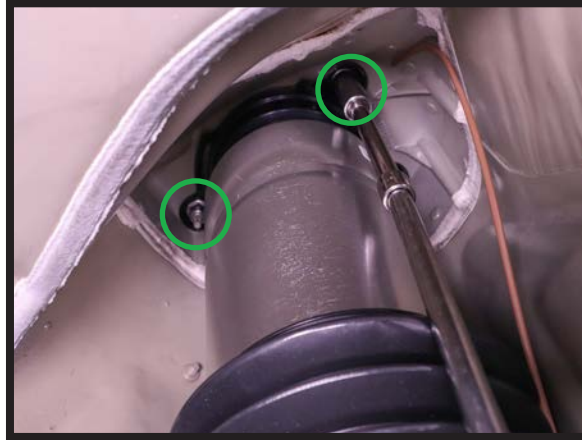

3. REINSTALL THE FACTORY BOTTOM MOUNT BOLT AND NUT. TIGHTEN TO MANUFACTURER'S SPECIFICATIONS. (FIGURES 13, 14)

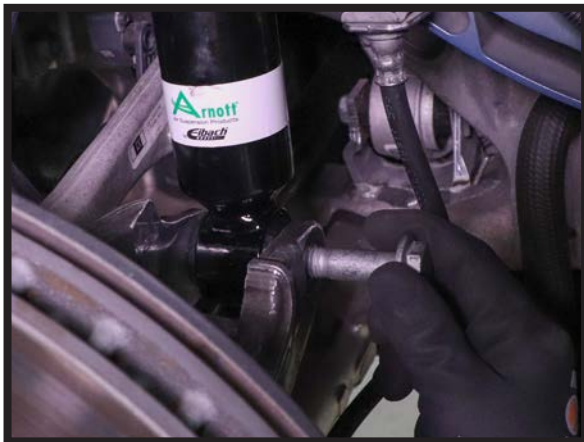

4. INSTALL AIR LINE INTO NEW AIR STRUT. PUSH IN AIR LINE UNTIL IT IS SEATED FIRMLY WITHIN THE FITTING. (FIGURES 15, 16)

5. REINSTALL THE APPLICABLE REAR WHEEL WELL LINER AND APPLICABLE WHEEL.
6. LOWER VEHICLE UNTIL THE WHEELS TOUCH THE GROUND. START VEHICLE AND ALLOW STRUT TO INFLATE.
7. LOWER VEHICLE COMPLETELY.
8. INSTALLATION COMPLETE.
