

BD Cummins 12V Cool Covers


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
PLEASE READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE INSTALLATION

Please note this revision will not fit the early style ARP head or A1 studs. These studs have an overly tall and wide nut that contacts a strength boss in the inside of the cool covers. If you've purchased your ARP studs after 2008 you should not have a problem.

KIT CONTENTS:

Please check to make sure that you have all the parts listed in this kit before you start the disassembly of your truck.





Welcome

Thank you for purchasing the Cummins 12V Cool Covers. The cool covers are an attractive way to make your engine look new again. ¹/₄" thick cast Aluminum, and a powder coated exterior ensure a long lasting look.

Required Tools

- Ratchet
- 15mm socket
- 19mm Socket (1994-1998 Trucks)
- 13mm Socket (1988-1993 Trucks)
- Torque Wrench (18 ftlbs)

INSTALLATION

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 1. Remove the factory tin Cummins name plate off the top of the engine. For 1988-1993 trucks you will use a 13mm socket. For 1994-1998 trucks you will use a 19mm socket. Once remove discard or send to your sorry friend with a Ford. 	<image/>
 2. Using a 15mm socket remove each of the valve covers. Discard the valve cover gaskets from the bottom of the valve cover. Clean the area on the head where the valve cover gaskets mates. 	<image/>


3. Inspect the valve cover bolt and remove the oring that sits underneath the bolt head.

 Insert the supplied valve cover gaskets onto the bottom of the cool covers and install.

You will need to place a newly supplied oring underneath the bolt head. This will act as the compressing force to hold the valve cover in place.

Before torqueing the valve covers in place. Use a long straight edge to align the sides of the valve covers to each other. This ensures the valve covers are parallel to each other. While torquing the valve covers have someone hold the straight edge to ensure the valve covers do not twist.

Torque the valve cover bolt to **18ftlbs.**



Using a degreaser clean the cool covers and your all finished.

If you would like to replace the front and back valve cover bolts to eliminate the raised studs section, the Cummins part # for the standard bolt is 3907049.
