INSTALLATION

- 1. Using a properly rated jack, raise the rear of the vehicle and support the frame rails with jack stands. Ensure the jack stands are secure and set properly before lowering the jack. NEVER WORK UNDER AN UNSUPPORTED VEHICLE. Remove the rear wheels.
- 2. Remove the OEM rear shocks using a 21mm socket/wrench. [FIGURE 1]

- 3. Install ICON shock with the shaft pointing upwards.
- 4. First, install the upper bolt using a 21mm socket/wrench. [Torque to factory spec]

5. Sand the lower shock mount as shown. Failure to trim the shock mount will result in shock damage. [FIGURE 2 & 3]

6. Install the lower bolt using a 21mm. [Torque to factory spec]

- **7** Mount the reservoir to the shock body using a 5/16" nut driver with the supplied hourglass isolators and hose clamps.
- 8. Reinstall wheels and lower the vehicle back to the ground.

VERIFY ALL FASTENERS ARE PROPERLY TORQUED BEFORE DRIVING VEHICLE.

RETORQUE ALL NUTS, BOLTS AND LUGS AFTER 100 MILES AND PERIODICALLY THEREAFTER.
