K&N<sup>®</sup> <u>Cabin Air Filters</u> replace your vehicle's stock cabin filter with a reusable design that cleans and freshens incoming air. They are electrostatically charged to grab and hold dust particles. K&N<sup>®</sup> cabin air filters help control odors while they help capture most mold, mildew, fungus, spores, bacteria and germs. When they get dirty they can be cleaned and reused and best of all, they come with a 10 year/100,000 mile limited warranty.

When applicable, refer to owner's manual for manufactures installation/removal instructions. The following are helpful steps when replacing/servicing cabin air filter with K&N<sup>®</sup> cabin air filter.

- 1. Open glove box compartment. Fig. 1
- 2. Locate glove box stop features. In most vehicles these are located on the left and right side of the glove box. Fig. 2
- 3. Remove fasteners holding stop features. Fig. 3
- 4. On the right side of the glove box, remove the shock hook. NOTE: This can either be held by tabs or a screw. Fig. 4
- 5. When all stop features are removed, glove box will be able to hang freely to gain access to cabin filter housing. Fig. 5
- 6. Remove cabin filter cover from housing. NOTE: Some applications have a cover that may include a tray.
- 7. Remove dirty cabin filter. NOTE: Remove any debris that might be present on cabin filter tray and inside the cabin filter housing. Fig. 6
- 8. Install K&N $^{\mbox{\tiny 8}}$  Cabin Filter. Cabin filter will only fit in one direction. Fig. 7
- 9. Reverse steps 1-6 to complete cabin filter installation. With the cabin filter installed, clean an area on the housing and apply the K&N<sup>®</sup> Stop Decal. The decal will help notify others that this is a reusable cabin filter.


