
Alignment Adjustability Restrictions 1999-2007 General Motors Trucks

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PROBLEM:

Alignment adjustability restrictions

- OE adjustments may not provide adequate range to obtain a proper alignment on late model Chevrolet and GMC light trucks.
- Excessive positive or negative camber will cause the vehicle to pull left or right and will create wear on the inside or outside edge of the tire.


