
MOUNTING BRACKET KIT

INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS



IMPORTANT: All brackets **must** be assembled with all the bolts left loose for final adjustment and positioning (before tightening) unless otherwise instructed. All bolts *must* be torqued for proper strength. If more than one bolt is used per fastening point, the diagram may only show one.

> Use flat washers over all slotted holes Use lock washers on all fasteners

Failure to follow these instructions WARNING Failure to follow these instructions can result in property damage, personal injury or even death.

- · Installation of most mounting brackets requires moderate mechanical aptitude and skills. We strongly recommend professional installation by an experienced installer.
- · The installer must read the instructions and use all bolts and parts supplied. Failure to do so could result in loss of the towed vehicle.
- · Use Loctite® Red on all bolts used for mounting this bracket.
- Do not use this document for custom fabrication, as it may not show all parts or structural components. Custom fabrication or an attempt to copy this bracket design could result in loss of the towed vehicle.
- · Every 3,000 miles, the owner must inspect the fasteners for proper torque, according to the bolt torque requirements chart on the last page of these instructions. The owner must also inspect all mounts and brackets for cracks or other signs of fatigue every 3,000 miles. Failure to do so could result in loss of the towed vehicle.
- · The owner must check the vehicle manufacturer's instructions for the proper procedure(s) to prepare the vehicle for towing. Some vehicles must be equipped with a transmission lube pump, an axle disconnect, driveline disconnect or free-wheeling hubs before they can be towed. Failure to properly equip the vehicle will cause severe damage to the transmission.
- If running changes were made by the vehicle manufacturer after this bracket was designed, some bolts or other fasteners in the hardware pack may no longer be the correct size. It is the installer's responsibility to verify that the bracket is securely fastened to the vehicle and fitted with the correct hardware to account for these changes. Failure to securely

fasten the bracket could result in loss of the towed vehicle.

- If the towed vehicle has been in an accident, it must be properly repaired before attaching the bracket. Do not install the bracket if any structural frame damage is found. Failure to repair the damage could result in the loss of the towed vehicle.
- · Some motorhome chassis have such a tight turning radius that you can damage your motorhome, towed vehicle, tow bar or bracket while turning sharply. Before getting on the road, test your turning radius in an empty parking lot. Turning too sharply could result in non-warranty damage to towing system, motorhome and/or towed vehicle.
- · Do not back up with the towed vehicle attached or non-warranty damage will occur to your towing system, motorhome and/or towed vehicle.
- The safety cables must connect the towing vehicle to the towed vehicle frame to frame, with the cables crossed, with enough slack for sharp turns. Refer to the cable instructions for proper routing. Failure to leave enough slack in the safety cables, or failure to connect the safety cables frame to frame, will result in the loss of the towed vehicle.
- · This bracket is designed for use with ROADMASTER tow bars and ROAD-MASTER adaptors only. Using this bracket with other brands, without an approved ROADMASTER adaptor, may result in non-warranty damage
- · Upon final installation, the installer must inspect the bracket to ensure adequate clearance, particularly around hoses, air conditioner lines, radiators, etc., or non-warranty damage to the towed vehicle will result.
- This bracket is only warranteed for the original installation. Installing a used bracket on another vehicle is not recommended and will void the warranty.

MOUNTING BRACKET KIT INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

KIT NO. 910-1

- 1. Important: please use all supplied bolts and parts and read all instructions carefully before beginning this installation. The majority of questions you may have can be answered within the text, and proper installation will ensure safe and secure travel. Now, begin the installation. This bracket kit is one of our XL series, which is designed to be partly removable. The kit consists of the main receiver brace, front braces, rear braces and a hardware pack. The main receiver brace mounts behind and below the front bumper fascia to the front frame and tie down plate mounting area. The front braces insert into the receiver brace on each side. Start by laying the kit out according to the illustration. This will give you a visual idea of how the kit installs and also confirm that the kit components are present and accounted for.
- 2. Start by removing two 10mm bolts on the top of each front fog light. Remove the plastic retainer under the back side of the fog lights to access the plastic nut on rear of each fog light. Remove the plastic nuts and pull the lights out and set aside. This will give you access to the tie down plate mounting area.
- 3. Pull a fastener out of the front of the fender well liner on each side and pull down.
- 4. Remove three tie down plate bolts on each side and discard the tie down plates. *Note:* the front lower bolt is difficult to access unless the plastic fascia in the fog light mounting area is pulled in for clearance.
- 5. Hold the main receiver brace up to the bottom of the vehicle and bolt in place using the tie down plate bolts. Leave bolts loose for now.
- 6. Find the end of each bumper bracket and remove the last 10mm bolt. This is located approximately 14" to the rear of the tie down plate mounting area.
- 7. Take a supplied 10mm x 1.25 x 110mm bolt, lock washer and flat washer and bolt through the rear brace on each side.
- 8. Bolt the front of the rear braces to the back of the main receiver brace on each side with ½" x 1½" bolts, flat washers and lock washers. Now, torque all mounting bolts to the specifications below.
- 9. Insert the front braces into the receiver tubes and pin with 5/8" draw pins and 1/8" spring pins.
- 10. Install the tow bar according to the manufacturer's instructions.
- 11. Attach one end of the included 15" safety cables to the lower front hole in the side mounting plate on each side of the receiver brace with the included cable connectors. Connect the other end to the tow vehicle's safety cables and the tow bar.
