Having your list of 3 words will help you narrow the list down. Once you come up with your list of 3 words, write them down somewhere and refer back to them when evaluating your options.



#### 3. Sketch Something

Whether you're a professional artist or someone who can barely draw a stick figure, the process of drawing a sketch is beneficial. When we sit down to draw something, we have to mentally picture it first. As the sketch begins to take shape, the mental image sharpens.

If you're a great artist, you'll probably draw something that will look close to your final design. If you're an amateur, your sketch will give the designer a better idea of what you're looking for.

Note: If you want your custom emblem to resemble an emblem you found in step 1, you can probably skip this step. It's much easier to tell a designer, "I want it to look like this emblem, but with the following changes."
