



RUBBER CEMENT

Instructions

- 1. Clean area around puncture of dirt and grease.
- 2. Scuff area thoroughly with metal buffer or sandpaper.
- 3. Apply cement to buffed area slightly larger than patch to be applied. Work well into rubber and allow to dry.
- 4. Remove protective backing from patch.
- 5. Center patch over puncture and apply pressure from the center out to eliminate air bubbles and ensure strong bond.
- 6. Repair is ready for immediate use.

NOTE: When inserting repair plugs, rubber cement may be used for initial lubrication and ultimate adhesion.
